GIRLS AND WOMEN Program Conducted May 2023





Organizational Highlights



Bonazah used Twenty percent of the revenue to cover management and overhead costs. All our field staff were either volunteers or received a minimal stipend, included in management and overhead costs. Seven percent was for other expenses and sixty-six percent of the revenue went into our programs and services. Three-point seven percent was carryover to the beginning of 2024.
